Training:

You will receive 30 hours initial training to equip you to be a tutor. This is offered at a number of locations around the city, at various times during the year, depending on local demand. The training course will enable you to gain a credit on the NALA / WIT Higher Certificate in Arts (Literacy Development) programme.

Garda Vetting:

While on the training course, you will be asked to complete an application for Garda Vetting. All details are confidential.

Your commitment: We ask you to stay with the scheme for at least a year. Our students have been let down in the past; your commitment is vital to developing a sense of educational success.
