The International Space Apps Challenge is a collaboration, led by NASA, which focuses on space exploration & takes place over 48 hours in cities around the world. This is the first time the Challenge has come to Ireland.

Participants work on challenges that support NASA's mission directorates under five themes: Earth Watch, Technology in Space, Human Spaceflight, Robotics, Asteroids.

Registration opened in March & participants were sought from Secondary Schools, Third Level colleges, industry & the general public. All day yesterday they were busy working on their chosen projects here – today the public can see them & attend the prize-giving – at 5pm.

Prizes will be awarded for the best project & the Irish winners will go on to be judged by NASA for international prizes.
