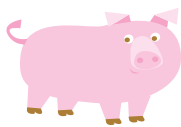

BREAD AND GAMES – 1937 REVISITED

The Mature Student Office UCC invites you to an event inspired by two themes from the Schools' Folklore Scheme. In 1937 the Irish Folklore Commission, in collaboration with the Department of Education and the Irish National Teachers' Organisation, encouraged children to collect folklore and local history. Over 18 months, some 100,000 children in 5,000 primary schools all over Ireland took part, and the material collected is now in the National Folklore Collection, UCD.

This morning two themes from that project are revisited & celebrated: bread & games. Pupils from Scoil Iosagáin in Blarney and St Peter's Community Secondary School, Passage West, demonstrate their skills in playing the games of 1937 and cooking griddle bread. 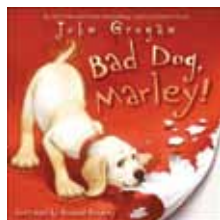

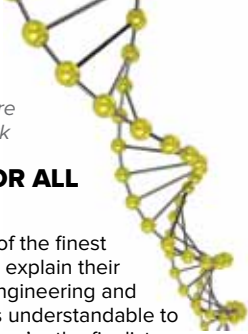
